* The Nancy Fessenden House ~ 151 Main Street ~ Colonial c. 1826 owned by Dan'l Webster Inn. The 2016 commemorative glass ornament '*The Sandwich Buoy*' is available for purchase.

* The Silas Fish House ~ 4 School Street ~ Restored in 2015 while keeping original windows and millwork and incorporating salvaged wood beams during the renovation. Les Lutz, Director of Horticulture at Heritage Museums & Gardens will be making decorations using natural materials.

* The Thomas F. Dean House ~ 9 Summer Street ~ c. 1847 Greek Revival retains its original charm and is filled with 'treasures' from the past.

* The Braddock R. Childs House – 8 Summer Street ~ c. 1849 Greek Revival featuring modern renovations with an artist's touch.

* The Captain Nelson Crocker House ~ 17 Pleasant Street ~ c. 1830 and recently updated for today's simple living.

* The Charles Fessenden House ~ 174 Main Street ~ Gracious Federal Colonial c. 1847 represents the direct impact of the glassworks industry and prosperity of the period. Talk with a local archaeologist and discover the history behind the artifacts found at a Sandwich dig site.

* Hillport ~ 91 Route 6A ~ Craftsman style home built 1911 for William Barclay Parsons, the engineer who designed the Cape Cod Canal. Watch woodcarver Doug Amidon at work.

* The Summerhouse ~ 3 River Street ~ Renovated 19th Century Barn. This property was the 2015 Home Tour favorite and is back by popular demand.

* First Parish Church ~ 143 Main Street ~ built 1704 ~ renovated in 2003 as a single family home. Meet some of the artists of the Sandwich Arts Alliance.
